



Natural Area Rules & Regulations

- **Hours of operation are from 6:00 am to 10:30 pm** (except Mariana Butte Trail, Morey Wildlife Reserve & Prairie Ridge, which are open from dawn until dusk).
- Overnight parking or camping is prohibited.
- **Pets must be leashed** and under human control at all times. Owners must pick up and remove pet waste. Dogs are **not** permitted at Morey Wildlife Reserve or Prairie Ridge Natural Area.
- **Fishing is regulated by Colorado State Regulations.** Site-specific regulations apply. All persons age 16 & up are required to have a Colorado Fishing License to fish.
- Float tube/"belly boat" fishing permitted at River's Edge ponds (except Jayhawker North Pond). All other boating, swimming, wading, ice fishing, bow fishing, and ice skating are prohibited.
- Glass containers/bottles are prohibited. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- No open fires or flames. No gathering/cutting firewood.
- Bicycling permitted on designated trails only. Bicyclists yield to other trail users.
- Horses are not permitted on open lands or trails (except at Prairie Ridge via Coyote Ridge trail, and police use).
- Motorized vehicles (except authorized) are not allowed outside of established streets and parking areas. Parking allowed in designated areas only.
- Remote control motorized vehicles, including drones, are not allowed on open lands or trails.
- No littering, graffiti or markings on property/facilities.
- No discharge or use of firearms, projectiles, fireworks.
- No feeding, trapping, hunting, or disturbing wildlife.
- Collecting, removing, destroying, or defacing any natural or manmade object is prohibited.
- Shade structures are available for drop-in use and are not reservable, except for city authorized programs.
- Smoking is prohibited.
- Noise Ordinance is strictly enforced.
- Commercial, retail and vending activities are not allowed on open lands or trails without a permit from the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Private landscaping or use of open lands, including extensions of backyard landscaping, trash or rubbish dumping, or other unauthorized use, is prohibited.
- Any encroachment or storage of privately owned items on open lands is prohibited.
